So every so often Pastor Lesslie...and I after Pastor Lesslie died...ordered him socks...and brought him copies of the New York Times...and snuck in his favorite candy...and there we would sit for hours on end...him talking about life...and me listening.

He was talking about life...life on the streets...life growing up...and life eternal.

I can still remember when George would come to church...someone would drive him to worship...and he would sit in the Narthex...and hand out quarters to the kids that were there...and the funny part about that...no one ever asked him where he got those quarters!

And I can also clearly remember the day...when the phone rang...and Betty (my secretary) picked it up...and said, **Pastor, you need to take this...George died.**

To make a short story long!...we had a beautiful service at the nursing facility for George...and EVERYONE that worked there attended. And I remember well...I talked about LIFE!

But still...there was something strange about George...

After he died...at the cemetery...I learned a whole different side of George...a side that I don't think many people knew...not me...and I'm guessing, not Pastor Lesslie...not anyone.

George had a bank account...with a balance totaling over \$250,000.00!!! Mind you...this was back in the 1990's.

I know...strange! In October of 1994...George died...in his room...with his New York Times on his bed...candy in his drawer...and a new package of socks on his dresser...that was it!

In March 2011, Michele Zane our kindergarten teacher attended an auction, where she saw an aquaponic system for bid. After seeing the system, Ms. Zane thought that having one at Our Redeemer Lutheran School would be beneficial for the students. Through a friend, she was connected with the co-founder of Hapa Farms, Reyn Horner. With the help of Mr. Horner, Ms. Zane was introduced and taught about aquaponic systems over the summer. On September 9th and 10th she purchased and constructed Our Redeemer Lutheran School's first aquaponic system. The PTO graciously reimbursed Ms. Zane for the purchase.

The children in kindergarten learn about living and non-living things as a part of their curriculum. With the new aquaponic system they are learning hands on about plants, animals and the relationship that they have with each other. This system not only teaches them about science through experience, but also teaches them responsibility. The children are responsible for feeding the fishes and reminding Ms. Zane to check on the system to make sure it is running correctly.

The aquaponic system is available for use by all of the grades. Everyone (students, teachers, & staff) are excited about it! Please feel free to stop by the school to "check it out."

Lutheran High School of Hawaii welcomes **Pastor Bill Carney** - Christian Life 11 and Ms. **Nelda Peterson** - Christian Life 9.

A look at the high school calendar reveals a number of tests which are administered to students at the school. What do labels such as ASVAB or PSAT stand for?

These acronyms represent tests that are part of Lutheran High's academic and career testing and counseling program. Students at all grade levels participate in school-sponsored testing for several important reasons.

New students take the OLSAT (Otis-Lennon School Ability Test), math placement tests and tests for class credit in Keyboarding and Introduction to Computers.

Three important tests were administered in September. Sophomores were given the ASVAB and PLAN tests. In October, juniors will take the PSAT. (Sophomores have the option of taking this test also.) Dr. Frank Lutz, Academic Dean at Lutheran High, administers the testing program.

ASVAB, given to all sophomores, stands for Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery. According to Dr. Lutz, ASVAB is "an excellent career guidance test. It concentrates on aptitudes, interests, and the corresponding career choices. It is a good supplement to our guidance program." The ability component of this test also helps to determine students who qualify for the Merit Roll.

Prayer Requests

On Sunday mornings, when you have a prayer request, you will find a prayer request card at the visitors' guest book stand. Or you can ask the ushers for one. Sophomores are also given PLAN, the preliminary ACT test. This helps them prepare for the college entrance ACT and also includes an interest survey and career guidance component even better than the ASVAB career component.

Juniors are given the PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test). Besides preparing them for the college entrance SAT, this test is also the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship program.

Freshmen take the S.A.T. (Stanford Achievement Test) in January. This test provides guidance for academic programs and summer school decisions.

AP (Advanced Placement) tests are required for students taking AP Art and AP Calculus. Subject-area tests (SAT II) are also available.

All the tests not only help students know where they stand with their peers in ability and achievement, but also help the school evaluate its curricular program and adjust course instruction if necessary. [DU]

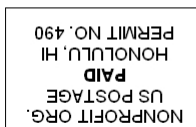
