His favor. I scratch God's back...and God scratches my back.

But that is **NOT** the kind of trade the Bible envisions. Because ultimately...I have nothing to give God...I am a sinner. And any sacrifice I offer Him...any obedience I offer Him...would be polluted by my sin. I **CANNOT** scratch God's back...because my trades are polluted with disobedience.

Nope...the exchange...the trade...goes like this...**God gave Jesus who knew no sin, to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God** (2 Corinthians 5:21)...**Our Lord Jesus, was rich, yet for our sakes He became poor, so that by His poverty you might become rich** (2 Corinthians 8:9).

Jesus...by becoming human and dying for us...makes a trade. He trades His righteousness for our sin. He trades His divine riches for our lowly poverty. He trades His divinity for our humanity. And in return...we receive righteousness...we receive the riches of God's love...we receive membership in God's family.

An odd trade, when you think about it, don't you think?! Trades are supposed to be pretty much equal. When I trade for something...I usually trade of equal value. Although I would **LOVE** for someone to accept my trade of my car for a 2011...powder-blue Mazda RX-8...I'm sure it would not happen!

And if the Yankees traded Robbie Cano and Derek Jeter for a couple of no-name...Double A players with "okay" records and stats"...I am sure panic would break out in NYC...and riots invading the streets of downtown Manhattan!

And if I said to Donna...'you let me buy that **2011 powder blue Mazda RX-8...and I'll let you go ahead and buy that new dress...I might end up bunking with Clarence!**

Yet...God is willing to make what seems like an awful trade.

In the crucified Jesus...He takes my sin and gives me His righteousness. He trades my Spiritual poverty and gives me His Spiritual riches. He takes my humanity on Himself and makes me God's child!

He sacrifices for me. He makes trades in which He gets the short end of the stick...and in this case...the stick is...His cross! Because the trade He makes means...going to the cross. Swapping my sins for His righteousness means that...He must **die** for those sins. But He's willing to make that trade...because He loves you and me with a self-giving, sacrificial love.

He knows that there can be no **even trades** between us sinners and Himself...so He submits to a

grossly unfair trade. He scratches our backs with salvation...and forgiveness...but He allows His own back to be scratched by the cross of Calvary..

Yes...God...through Jesus...is **willing** to trade our sins...for His salvation...Praise God!

What???...you want to make a trade for my M&M's...**no way!**

All this from a silly TV show...yup...that's my **Thoughts and Ponderings!**

A quick glance at my calendar finds me in "sheer disbelief" that it is actually September. Where has the time gone? It seems as though school just began (July 27, 2011) and now

we are at mid quarter time. Mid Quarter grades went home on Tuesday, August 30, 2011.

Parent Teacher Conferences will be held on Friday, September 9, 2011.

The Kindergarten through Third Grade attended the HTY (Honolulu Theatre for Youth) production of "Anime Momotaro." "This exciting and original staging of Japan's most famous folktale brings new life to the story of a boy who sprang from a peach. This production teaches powerful lessons about inner strength and one's ability to stand up against bullying."

(Add to this, of course, what we teach the students: **"Our Strength Comes From Jesus!"**)

Our first, of two, Scholastic Book Fairs is scheduled for September 12th through 15th. Parent volunteers will come in on the afternoon of September 9th to help set up the event. The preview date for classes (Pre K through 8th grade) will be on Monday, September 12. Students write out "wish lists" of what they hope their parents will allow them to buy. On September 14, students in Pre-K through 3rd grade will have their grandparents attend school with them during the morning hours. Grandparents (or aunties, uncles, or parents) attend chapel with the students. After chapel they return to the classroom for refreshments and activities. They also visit the book fair. It's always great fun!

Every Wednesday, ORLS students (Pre-K through 8th Grade) attend Chapel. Chapel is led by teachers and their classes, the Pastor, and Principal on a rotating basis. However, something "New" is taking place this year. Our middle school students (grades 6/7/8) will attend high school chapel with the LHS students every third Thursday of the month rather than attending the Wednesday Chapel with us that week.

Mark your calendars on **Sunday, September 25, 2011**, the Band and String Ensemble will participate at the **9:00 A.M. Worship Service**. At that Service, also, will be the installation and Rededication of Pre-K through 12 faculty and staff.

Sunday Scripture Readings - Each Sunday's scripture lessons and readings are based on a three-year cycle. In liturgic terms, the readings are organized in a lectionary. A lectionary is a collection of readings from Sacred Scripture. These readings are arranged according to the Church's calendar and are intended to be read at the regular, weekly gathering of God's people.

The lectionary provides Sunday readings that begin with the season of Advent. For each Sunday and festival, three scripture readings are listed from the

Old Testament, the New Testament (an Epistle reading) and a Gospel reading. Psalms for the Introit are also appointed. These scripture readings are often the basis of the sermon for that Sunday.

At Our Redeemer, we have adopted the most commonly used lectionary - the Three-Year Series (A, B, C). Until Advent 2011, we are in Year A which focuses on the Gospel of Matthew. Beginning at the end of November, we will move into Year B which focuses on the Gospel of Mark and selections from the Gospel of John. In late November 2012, we will enter Year C which focuses on the Gospel of Luke. If you would like an advance look please visit:

Here are lectionary summaries for September 4 and September 11.:

September 4- Living as Humble Little Children of the Father

True greatness is not self-sufficient strength, but humility like that of a little child. The greatness of child-like faith receives all good things as gracious gifts from our Father in heaven. Apart from such faith, “*you will never enter the kingdom of heaven,*” but whoever is humbled like a little child will be “*the greatest in the kingdom of heaven*” (Matt. 18:3–4). Though in our sin we deserve to be “*drowned in the depth of the sea*” (Matt. 18:6), we have instead been drowned (“buried”) with Christ in Baptism and then raised to the new, humble life of a child of God. The Lord sends His watchman to warn us with a word from His mouth, in order that we may not die in our iniquity, but be turned from our pride and

selfishness to live (Ezek. 33:7–9). Thus we live in humility and faith before God as well as in love for our neighbor, which “*is the fulfilling of the law*” (Rom. 13:10). In the reverent fear of God, we do no harm to our neighbor, but we “*pay to all what is owed to them*” (Rom. 13:7) and we “*owe no one anything, except to love each other*” (Rom. 13:8).

September 11 Forgiving as the Lord Forgives Us

In settling His accounts with us, our Lord acts not with anger, but with compassion. He does not imprison us as we deserve, but He forgives all our debts and releases us (Matt. 18:23–27). Therefore, our Lord bids each of us to have “*mercy on your fellow servant,*” and “*forgive your brother from your heart*” (Matt 18:33, 35). By the Lord’s forgiveness of our sins, we are free to forgive those who sin against us, because He has been handed over to the jailers in our stead, and He has paid our entire debt with His lifeblood. Whether we live or die, we “*are the Lord’s*” (Rom. 14:8). Since we all will “*stand before the judgment seat of God,*” we are not to despise our brother (Rom. 14:10), but gladly forgive him. By the grace of God, our brother also “*will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make him stand*” (Rom. 14:4). Though we daily sin against each other, the Lord intends “*to bring it about that many people should be kept alive*” (Gen. 50:20). Jesus speaks kindly by His Gospel and promises: “*I will provide for you and your little ones*” (Gen 50:21).

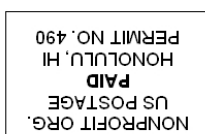
